FIRST YEAR CAMPER PROGRAMS

Each Scouts BSA Resident Camp at GSR offers a First Year Camper program, focusing on select requirements for the Scout, Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class ranks.



YOUR CAMPSITE, YOUR HOME

Your campsite is your home base for the week. Each campsite comes equipped with:


- Canvas tents on wooden platforms
- Cots (two per tent)
- Picnic Tables
- Shade Fly
- Campfire Circle
- Latrine w/ handwashing stand and potable water

Troops are assigned their campsites prior to arrival at GSR and are guided to their site after arrival by a staff member (site guide).

AMENITIES

We're here for your every need! Goshen Scout Reservation has several facilities and amenities to help you to be comfortable during your stay with us (vary camp to camp).

- Camp Olmsted: Indoor Dining Hall
- Shower House Ventilation upgraded in 2025 at select facilities!
 - 17 Single Shower Stalls
 - Flushing Bathrooms
- Shared Leader's Lounge at all camps
 - Fiberoptic Internet at Camp Marriott, with plans to expand
 - Wi-Fi Pucks at Camp Olmsted & Bowman
 - Primary Cell Phone Provider: Verizon
- Electricity available in buildings for charging electronics
- Camp Post (Headquarters): Adult leader training facility & Internet







DINING SERVICES

Goshen Scout Reservation offers three dining styles for Scouts BSA unit based on their camp selection – Dining Hall, Patrol Cooking, and Heater Stack.

- Dining Hall: Meals served family style (food brought to your tables to self serve)
- Patrol Cooking: Scouts cook each meal in their campsite.
- Heater Stack: Scouts pick up cooked food from the commissary and bring back to their campsite.
- Sunday dinner through Saturday breakfast are provided
- Nut free dining facility
- Fresh fruit available at all times

SUPPPORTING DIETARY NEEDS

We're prepared to support you and your Scouts for all their dining needs!

- Nut-free dining facility
- We're prepared for you!
 - Dedicated vegetarian menu
 - Food allergy and dietary restriction accommodation
 - Including gluten free and dairy free
 - Ingredient lists available on request

Dietary restrictions and allergies must be reported as a part of your camper registration and prior to arrival to provide the best possible service.





FIRST AID & HEALTH LODGE

Each GSR resident camp has a dedicated First Aid room, where a trained staff member is available 24 hours a day.

Your camp first aider has access to the Goshen Scout Reservation Health Lodge team, comprised of trained medical professionals to provide consult and additional support.

We maintain a close relationship with our local medical and emergency services, allowing us to connect you with the best care possible when beyond Scout-rendered first aid is needed, including mental health support and counseling.

TRADING POST

The most popular spot at camp! Goshen Scout Reservation supports a trading post at each of our resident camps, where we supply:

- Apparel (T-Shirts, Hoodies, Sweatpants, Socks, etc.)
- Souvenirs
- Camping Equipment
- Snacks & Ice Cream
- Drinks & Slushies

The Memorial Trading Post, located at GSR's headquarters', Camp Post, also includes the Goshen Scout Reservation Museum, as well as merchandise for all 5 of our camp operations.

- Unit Registration Fee: \$200.00
 - Helps us to be best prepared for your arrival at Goshen Scout Reservation
 - Separate from camper costs, non refundable
- Camper Deposit: \$100.00
 - Due February 15, 2026
 - Gains commitment for camper attendance early, applied to individual camper cost
- Free Adults: Receive one free adult for every 10 registered youth





FINANCIAL AID / CAMPERSHIPS

We believe that no youth should be turned away from the opportunity to attend summer camp. National Capital Area Council provides financial aid up to 50% of the cost of camp.

- To apply for a "campership", visit the financial support page on www.ncacscouting.org.
 - To apply for a campership at the Goshen Scout Reservation, select "NCAC Scouts BSA Resident Camp at Goshen" on the financial assistance request form
 - Recipients will receive a campership voucher to apply to their camp registration

ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

All Scouting America membership and supervision requirements must be followed, as detailed in the Guide for Safe Scouting.

- At all times, a unit must have two adults over the age of 21 who are registered in Scouting America present.
 - If your unit has a youth female camper attending, then one of the registered adult leaders must be female
- In Scouts BSA, all attending adults and youth must be current members of Scouting America at time of attendance.
 - Registration as a merit badge counselor position does not meet this requirement. Please refer to the Guide for Safe Scouting for a list of approved adult registration fee required positions.
- Have an adult who can't attend a full week of camp? Split the week
 with another adult!
